

With Colorado roots, our clients liked the idea of incorporating a lot of stone and wood into the design. They also wanted the home to be comfortable for the family, while providing a great place to entertain. Finally, they sought to invest in the features that would make the residence energy efficient, as well as structurally sound for the centuries ahead.

After quickly dismissing the idea of trying to remodel the existing residence, the focus turned to developing the property and designing a new home to take full advantage of the site's potential. To achieve this objective, Weidmann supplemented its internal design resources with the services of architectural firm Kuo Diedrich, landscape architectural firm Quercus Studios, and independent designers Daniel DeSantis and Susan Seymour. With everyone's collective input, we were able to obtain maximum creativity – from laying out the horse/ATV trail around the property, to selecting the last cabinet pull.



The end result is a home for the ages. Everything revolves around the great room, with its vaulted ceiling, large stone fireplace, and tall pair of windows overlooking "the back 40." An impactful, but comfortable living environment is achieved by combining stone features in the great room, kitchen and bathrooms with the warmth and beauty of heart pine, white pine and mahogany throughout the main floors of the home. In contrast, the use of quarter sawn and reclaimed oak floors, walls and ceiling in the man-cave makes a statement!
